⁴³ The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee. Finding Philip, he said to him, "Follow me."



**Today is a day to simply introduce yourself to the text for the week. Read it over slowly several times in a leisurely way and reverential manner. This is a day of rest so don't work at this reading. Just drink it in and let the powerful word of God begin its work in you this week. Think of the excitement of meeting, Jesus, the living Word, in this passage this week.





In this passage we have various ways that disciples have encountered Jesus and decided to follow Him. Some (as in vs 36 and 37) simply follow Christ when they encounter Him. Others come as a result of a friend's invitation. Other are called by Christ and others are involved in a longer dialogue where Jesus interacts with their questions and doubts. Notice the differences in the call to discipleship in this passage and come reverently to Jesus as one of His disciples.



Bless every true disciple of Jesus with your interaction and instruction. It is such a privilege to be a true disciple of Jesus. Enjoy being identified with Jesus this week.
